

In 2016, 30% of all pupils in England did not achieve the expected standard at KS2 in mathematics ([Department for Education](#)).

Passport Maths is:

- an early intervention programme for Year 7 students who are not 'secondary ready' in mathematics and need help mastering the basics they have missed at primary level
- designed for students who did not achieve the expected standard at KS2 (scaled score less than 100 on the 2016 Key Stage 2 test)
- an additional provision that supports students who need to catch up with the mathematical ideas that are developed at greater depth at Key Stage 3
- a programme for progression in fundamental concepts, leading students to better outcomes at GCSE
- a unique program enabling students to follow and master the fundamentals which they have missed out on at primary school while progressing with the curriculum with the rest of their year-group



The Passport Maths programme:

- Five units, each with a number of modules, corresponding to different areas of the National Curriculum
 - Whole numbers
 - Algebra
 - Fractions, decimals and percentages
 - Geometry
 - Statistics
- Students undertake an additional two hours of catchup per week in the programme within a small group over 15 weeks, working on key concepts in manageable stages
- Progress is automatically tracked and recorded as an integral part of the online programme
- To encourage students to stay engaged throughout, they are rewarded with bronze, silver and gold awards for achievement.
